

Youth Camp

our opening service. Peyton Reardon sang beautiful song, "Lord You're the Best Thina That's Ever Happened to Me," before Pastor Lisa brought the Word in the form of an object lesson, 'One bad apple can spoil the whole bunch,' that everyone's got



attention. Using the verse from 1 Corinthians 15:33, "Be not deceived: evil communications corrupt good manners," she



gave an illustration using characters Jack & Jill. She used two transparent bags of sliced apples. Jack's apples had vinegar on them and were quite sour. The campers called out many things that would sour apples,

when they were asked, lying, smoking, drugs, swearing,

bullying etc. Jill's apples were cinnamon, and sugar coated and represented all the good habits and good influences. Again, the campers were very interactive in naming the good things that can be done to be a friend and help others in being kind and good. What would you rather eat, apples with vinegar, or with sugar and cinnamon? Of course, the latter is the sweetest tasting, and we will experience the sweetness of friendship with others and more importantly, friendship with Jesus when we do the things that are pleasing to Him. Choose good over bad and do what is right. Jesus will reward us for doing so.

Tuesday morning was our first morning service following a good breakfast. After some warmup choruses that included our theme song, Deidre presented an object lesson, with the help of Lincoln. She began with, "Who here has a lot of friends? Who here has a lot of Facebook friends? Who has a lot of true friends?" She talked about the value of friendship. In the Bible it talks about two friends, David and Jonathan.

Using John 15:12 the question was asked, "If you were drowning in a swimming pool and someone saved you and drowned, would you be grateful?" Just think about it, Jesus died for you!

Pastor Howard reiterated the message by Pastor Michael, and we sang, "I Will Cast All my Cares Upon You," with Pastor Lisa closing in prayer. Several stayed and prayed in the after service. We were excited to hear there were those who prayed through to salvation.

Ralinda gave a lesson using the subject of spider webs. Some of the facts regarding them were: they come in all shapes and sizes, sticky, strong, silk, are five times stronger than steel, they last a long time, and they are 20x thinner than hair. Also,

some are poisonous, some harmless but all beautiful, and all designed to capture prey. I Corinthians 10:13 "There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it."

Using objects such as a jar, balloon, paper, a lighter, straw as a trap, it was demonstrated that temptation lures us in, but God gives us a way out. You may feel - how am I gonna find a

way out? You may feel like there is temptation all around me, my friends are doing it, etc. Examples of temptation are Internet, peer pressure, stealing, cheating, being mean, bullying, lack of respect, TV programs, and music. **Trusting** the Lord will take us through it. Things may look



good for awhile, but they are sinful, and we get trapped. Dare to be different! Maybe you would be influenced to go to a party and are offered drinks, drugs, etc. You could leave even if you know your friend won't go. Stand up for what is right and hopefully your friend will follow if you leave! If your friends are all seeking to follow God, they will do the right thing. Adam and Eve sinned, so we are all prone to sin because we were born in sin. Read your Bible, pray every day. They are weapons against the enemy and will help us overcome these temptations.

On Wednesday evening we entered the chapel to hear music and singing. We joined the voices that sang, "Isn't it Grand to be a Christian," before service began. Due to the fact that we weren't going to have the traditional Talent Night as such, the campers performed their special songs on this, the final night. Camp Meeting

n Sunday morning, July 28, Reverend Christopher Hewlett welcomed everyone to our first service of Canada Camp Meeting 2024.

This warm welcome followed a beautiful selection by the choir, entitled, "Let the Fire Fall!" The theme of the congregational hymns was also that of renewal and fire, and of the Spirit moving in our midst.

There were several glorious testimonies given, including two sisters who opened the



testimony meeting after singing in a ladies quartet. We were off to a great start!

Arlene Randell Downton gave her testimony and told of how her heart is full. She got saved four years ago after pulling over on a highway while on her way to South Brook, NL and gave her heart to the Lord. She had spent the previous 30 years in the world and came back to the Lord.

Another sister, Stacey-Lee Wilcox witnessed how she had made a mess of her life by doing drugs and alcohol and tried to come back to the Lord on more than one occasion, but this time finally got a hold of something. She gave her heart to the Lord on February 11 of this year. She now gets excited when she hears God's Word!

Our District Superintendent, Reverend Hewlett delivered the opening message taking his text from *Ezekiel 22*.

29 The people of the land have used oppression, and exercised robbery, and have vexed the poor and needy: yea, they have oppressed the stranger wrongfully.

30 And I sought for a man among them, that should make up the hedge, and stand in the gap before me for the land, that I should not destroy it: but I found none.

He began with stating that it's disappointing when making a call and there is no answer and we get an answering machine, instead of a real person. How does God feel when he calls one of us, and there is no response? In *Acts 9:6* Paul

responded, he said, "Lord, what would thou have me to do?" We should think that way, for there are lots of workers needed. There ought to be people who are willing to make up the hedge and stand in the gap, for God.

Some of the highlights of our first evening evangelistic service on July 28 involved a trio from Kitchener who sang, "Come, Jesus Come," which was performed beautifully. Rochelle Reid, one of the trio shared in her testimony that it's been a rough year and that really is an understatement! After losing her husband tragically last July, she was broken. She stated that she is glad she kept holding on. What made the difference was God! When there is trouble, He will see you through. I'm not gonna give up!

Another sister said she was home for four months, sick. It started with a headache and got worse to the point that she saw fear in her husband's and children's eyes. God saw her through, and she is in now in Camp Meeting witnessing to the power of God.

A sister from Bide Arm testified that she doesn't like being alone, and when her husband, being a fisherman, was away for six months, she was very lonely. She prayed and said, "Lord, I can't take being alone." After that time, she always seemed to have someone, some family member with her. God really does answer prayer, and He cares about every detail of our lives.

Pastor Howard brought us a wonderful message, using II

Chronicles 36:15-16 "And the Lord God of their fathers sent to them by his messengers, rising up betimes, and sending; because he had compassion on his people, and on his dwelling place: But they mocked the messengers of God, and

despised his words, and misused his

prophets, until the wrath of the Lord arose against his people, till there was no remedy," as his opening text. The theme of his message was, "The Remedy." There is a line of divine patience that an individual or a nation can cross that will bring the wrath and judgment of God. There is just one word that gives us a picture of how merciful God is. Til, that means God's mercy was extended and that God is slow in taking His mercy away from individuals. It is God's arm of mercy that withholds His justice. It is possible that an individual may send themselves into a state of no forgiveness where they come to a point, they no longer have a desire within themselves to seek God's forgiveness. Basically, at this time you are at the point of no remedy. It is not on God's account,

that is on our own account because God continually calls and speaks. *Genesis 6:3 "And the Lord said, My spirit shall not always strive with man..."* God is not required to call us multiple times but in His mercy He does. It is in our own ability to desire and seek His salvation. Oh, that more would take this when it is free for all. If you don't know Jesus as your Saviour, the remedy is still available.

At the young adult service on Monday night, the song, "I Came Here Expecting God to Move," was playing pre-service. The words 'There is Power in The Blood' was displayed on the screen and it was an atmosphere to boost faith, for sure. The young adult choir sang a beautiful rendition of, "Days of Elijah." Parts of the lively hymn selections were done without



music, and it sounded like a grand choir! Another highlight of the service was a group from Ottawa, Edmonton and Calgary who sang, "Why Not You?"



Testimonies was opened by one in the group who said when he started going to the Apostolic Faith Church, his Father wasn't impressed, as he was going to the church where they're crying. He came from a very modest home, and not wanting change but after awhile he took his father to church, and mother too! It's because he was faithful!

Another testimony was given by a sister that could only speak in French. Through her interpreter, she shared that she is very grateful to the Lord for bringing her here. When she was brought to Canada she was brought to a church and said, "I can't go to that church," so she started praying, God show me the church to go to, and she prayed for months and months. God, show me the way, nobody speaks French, so show me the way. I went out there searching and found the Apostolic Faith. So that day I met two of my brothers. One is up there, (she referred to the platform) and this is my other. She praised the Lord that she was able to be here at Camp Meeting and her words interpreted. "All I can say is give praise to the Lord, He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life."

Ralinda sang a beautiful solo, "Broken World But not for Long," before brother Moses Akazue delivered the Word of God using Luke 8:43 "And a woman having an issue of blood twelve years, which had spent all her living upon physicians, neither could be healed of any. Came behind him, and touched the border of his garment:

immediately her issue of blood stanched." He said, until the whole world is saved from sin we need to keep preaching about a remedy. She's been to the doctors and the more she looked for a solution, the poorer she became and continued to suffer. The woman reached out to Jesus with all her strength. When a soul is sick today, they go everywhere but to the source. When a soul is sick of sin today, they go to doctor pleasure, they go to doctor entertainment or doctor self help. Every single kind of doctor except the real solution. If that is the story of anyone, there is only one doctor that brings real cure, that is Doctor Jesus.

text reference John 14:1 "Let not
your heart be troubled: ye believe
in God, believe also in me. In my
Father's house are many
mansions: if it were not so, I would
have told you. I go to prepare a place for

And if go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also. And whither I go ye know, and the way ye know." He refers to this scripture as the seed of the rapture. You must remember we are looking at Jesus here trying to comfort His disciples. For what reason? He told them He was going away, going back to His father and that He was coming back again. Jesus told them to not be troubled. Then He made the promise. This is the first indication that Christ was going to come back for His believers. When we talk about the coming of the Lord we have that expectation. That is our hope. It could happen at any moment, and we don't know the time. Additional Bible text was taken from Revelation 19:11, 1 Thessalonians, 1 Corinthians 15:50 & Philippians 3:17. It was a wonderful teaching of the many things the Christian look forward to, with the great hope that we have!

In the Tuesday evening evangelistic service, among the many highlights, Freeman Cull and his wife, Glenda opened the testimonies with the song, "So Many Reasons." They both shared their testimonies telling of the many reasons they are thankful to God!

Glenda, being the daughter of a minister, knew about salvation from a very early age. She received salvation for herself, and as a family they raised four children in a Christian home, one son, followed by three daughters! Three are

saved, and one daughter that is not saved. They are praying in faith and believing for her.

Freeman grew up around the church as well and had a real experience with the Lord as a young man and was sure of his salvation. The message was delivered by Pastor Robert Randell of our Kitchener church. Using the Book of *Malachi*, he stressed how security can be found in a God that doesn't change. We see the stability and power of God right from the beginning in *Genesis 1:1*.



Using several scripture references, he reinforced his message of an unchanging God, which included the story of the three Hebrew children.

Daniel 3:25 "....Lo, I see four men loose, walking in the midst of the fire, and they have no hurt; and the form of the fourth is like the Son of God." In a world where the only constant is change, it is awesome to know our God never changes!

Friday evening began with the choir selection, "Rejoice," which set the tone for this evangelistic service. There are so many reasons for the redeemed of God to rejoice! Some of the choruses included during testimonies, were, "Send Down the Power," and "I'm Going Up." There was a great volume of singing for these long-time favourites.

Jesse Reid shared a notable testimony of victory that is nothing short of a miracle. He was involved in a very serious vehicle accident over twenty years ago and came very close to death. He had liver damage, lung damage, and kidney damage etc., but God brought him through after much prayer. He gave his heart to the Lord and is now a living witness to the power of prayer. He gets very emotional when telling of God's mercy to him.

Brother Samson stood to preach using the Bible verse on the screen taken from Matthew 24:44, which read, "Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh." Large letters also read, BE READY - Are you ready? This is a very sobering question for all. The message was taken from

Hebrews 2:3 "How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation..." God delivers us from the flesh, sin, consequences of sin, and the devil, through salvation. There is a transformation from darkness, into light. The account in Acts 9 tells of the wonderful story of Saul's conversion to



"brother Paul." Several scriptures were used to reference how we must experience salvation in order to be Heaven ready.

On Saturday at 6:30 pm, the seats and musical instruments were set outside for a full outdoor service, and it was a





beautiful evening for this event. Many cars were parked as close as they could get, and some people were outside on their decks to listen. The young adults from multi branch churches began with a repeat of the musical selection, "Days of Elijah." There were other songs by our young adults that were performed beautifully.

Pastor George brought the message of 'The Cross' and encouraged all who are not saved to pray and receive Jesus into their hearts at this late hour of the dispensation of grace.

Invitation hymns followed to give people the opportunity to come to Jesus. He encouraged all listening via

different outlets to be saved!! All services from Camp Meeting were live streamed and can be viewed on YouTube.

The Sunday morning worship service on August 4, the last day of camp meetings, drew a crowd of believers and some unbelievers. The choir sang, "Let thy Mantle Fall on Me," and lively hymn selections followed. A trio from Fort McMurray sang, and each one shared their testimony. Brother Tobi

Three sisters and

four brothers were baptized!

Many greeted and mingled after the service as there were brothers and sisters in Christ who had met for the first time during theses services. Thank God for the fellowship that comes through serving our Heavenly Father. The final chorus sung was very fitting. "I'm on my Way to Heaven, and the Journey gets Sweeter Every Day!"
